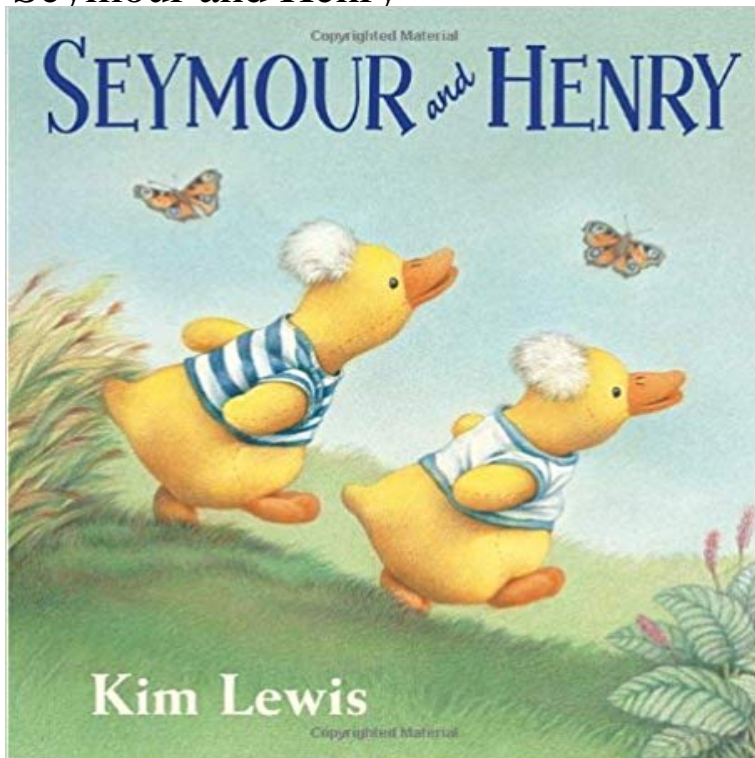


Seymour and Henry
