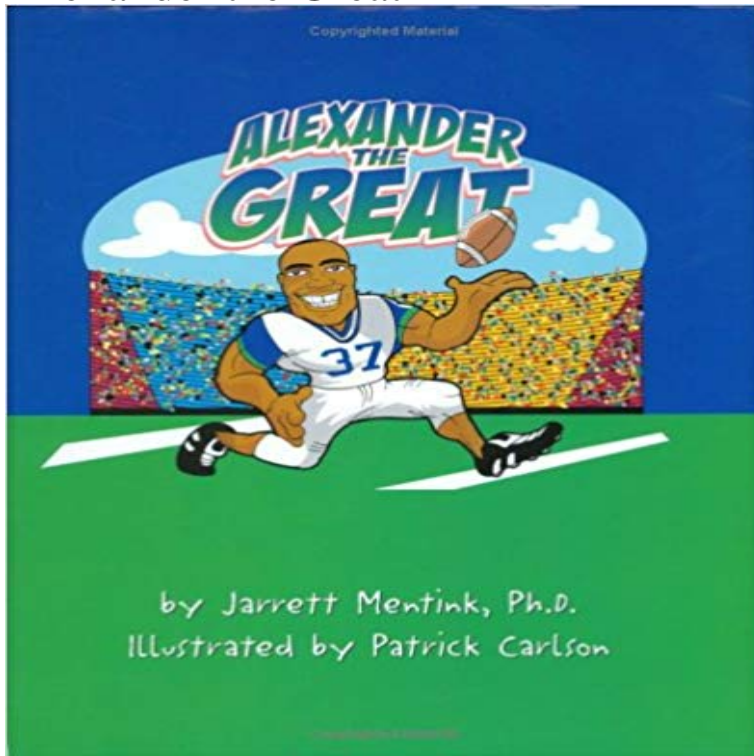


## Alexander the Great
