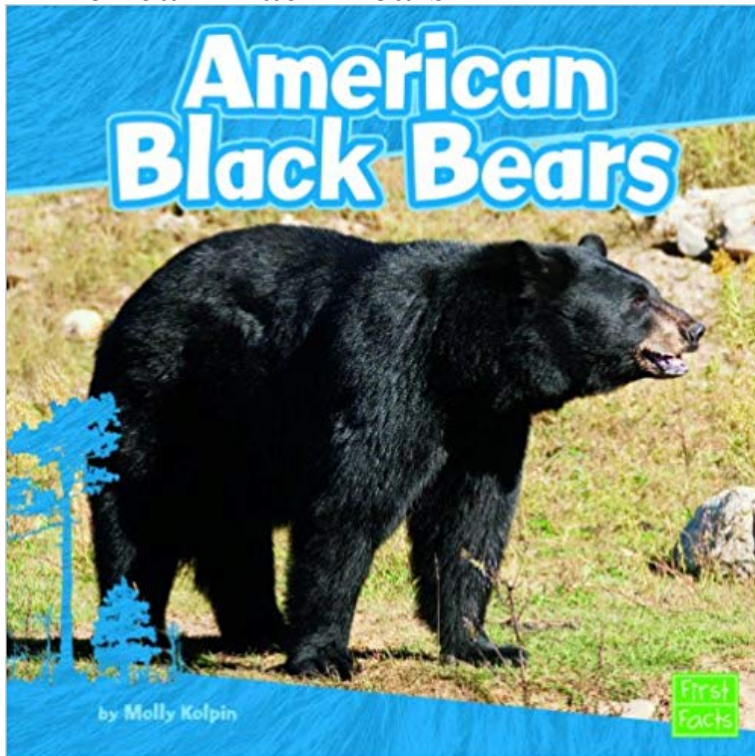


American Black Bears
