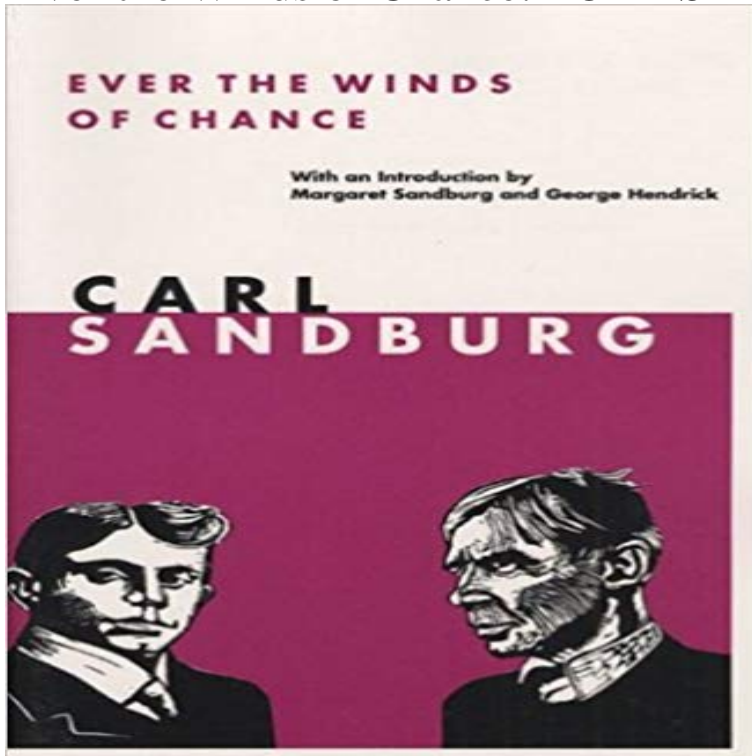


Ever the Winds of Chance: POEMS
