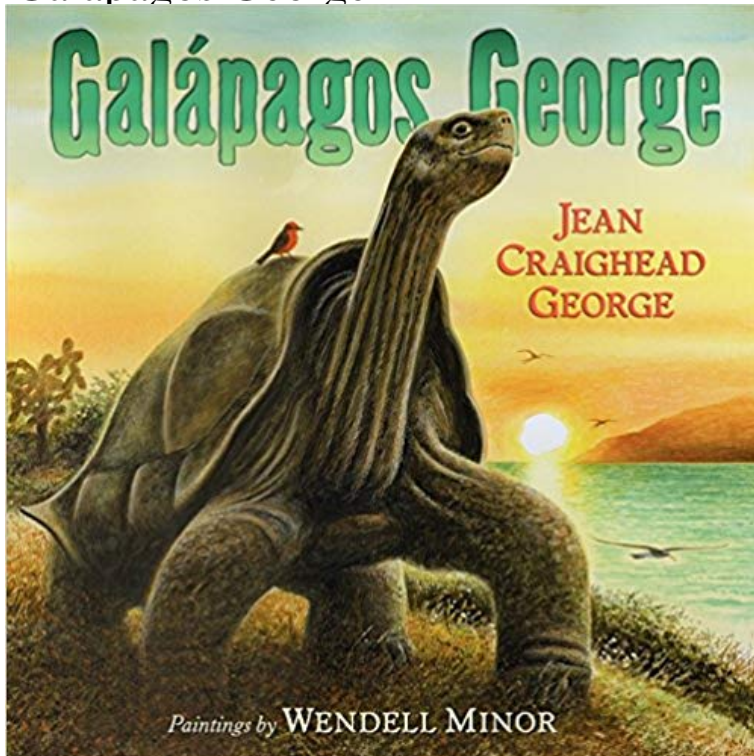


Galapagos George
