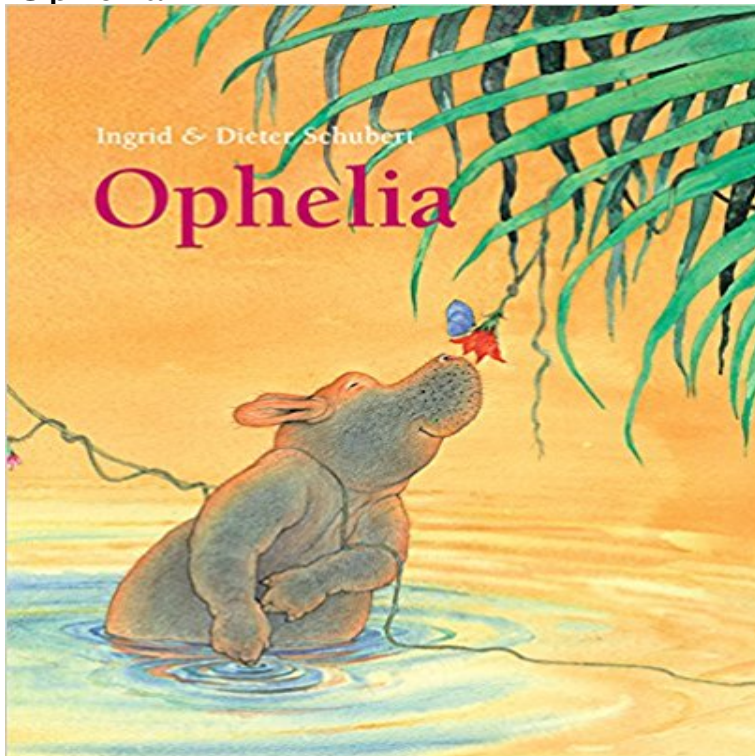


Ophelia
